Forecasters Miscalculate Storm's Affect on Millard

After trailing most of the game, Elkhorn South tied Friday night's match up with Millard west 52-52 with 4:43 left in the game.

The Wildcat defense, led by Giavonni Guido, forced four consecutive turnovers and went on an 8-0 run to put the Storm out of reach.

Four Wildcats scored in double digits. Austin Harris and Brock Burling both scored 16 points. Guido and Chris Connell added 12 points to the effort.

Ben Liable led all scorers with 25 points, and Mick Williams added 17 points for Elkhorn South.

"This was a good game for us in a great environment. I think the people that came out for the game got their money's worth," Coach Bill Morrison said.

Millard West jumped out to an early 7-2 lead by scoring on their first three possessions. Elkhorn South responded with back-to-back three's and took their only lead of the game, 8-7.

West answered with a10-0 run only to be followed by the Storm's 12-2 run to finish the quarter. The two teams were tied 20-20 after the first period.

Connell lifted the Wildcats to a 25-20 lead by scoring five points in the first minute of the second quarter.

West's offense continue to click in the 2nd quarter as their defense held the Storm to 11 points in the quarter. West led 40-31 at half-time.

"I thought we moved the ball really well and moved without the ball as good as we have all year," Morrison said. "We had 21 assists tonight. Six of them in the 2nd quarter."

Williams and Laible would not let Elkhorn South go down without a fight. The two scored all 14 of the team's points in the 2nd quarter as Elkhorn South cut the lead to 49-45 after the 3rd quarter.

Harris hit a 3-pointer to start the 4th quarter for the Wildcats. But, West would not score in their next six possessions, allowing Elkhorn South to tie the score 52-52.

"I thought we were trying to do too much to start the 4th quarter," Morrison said. "It felt like we were trying to make big plays instead of doing what we did tin the first three quarter."

Guido sparked the Wildcats by scoring five points on 2 steals and got a deflection that led to another steal.

With a 60-52 lead and under 3 minutes left in the game, West slowed the game down and finished the game out at the free-throw line..

Williams hit a 3-pointer for the Storm to draw Elkhorn South to 62-59, but could not get any closer.

Millard West Uses First Half To Beat Fremont

After a slow first quarter, Millard West used a 14-0 run to take control of the game and beat Fremont 60-46.

Giavonni Guido led the Wildcats with an impressive performance. He recorded 22 points, 7 steals, 7 rebounds, and 6 assists on the night.

Riley Harms and Zach Woehrer led the Tigers with 23 and 13 points respectively.

Fremont controlled the tempo early and took a 4-0 lead. West scored on seven consecutive possessions, including 9 points by Guido, and led 15-9 at the end of the period.

The Tigers cut the lead to 19-16 on a basket by Harms with 5:20 left in the quarter..

West went on their 14-0 run and led 33-16 with 1:50 left in the half. Fremont ended the quarter by forcing four turnovers and going on a 4-0 run to trail 33-20 at the break.

"Gio really set the tempo for us on defense in the first half," Coach Bill

Morrison said. "Once we took a little control over the tempo, we started to play pretty well."

Fremont outscored West 16-11 in the 2nd quarter. They got as close as 42-36 after a 3-pointer by Woehrer. Harms and Woehrer scored all of the Tiger points in the 3rd quarter.

Millard West did just enough in the final period to keep the Tigers from mounting a comeback. A 3-pointer by Austin Callahan with 2:55 left made the score 54-46. Fremont would not score the rest of the game.

"I didn't think we played with much intensity in the 2nd half," Morrison said. "We wanted to get some traps to force the tempo, and we weren't aggressive enough to get that done."
