## Wildcat Teams Combine for Undefeated Week

# Wildcats Pull Away From Chieftains in the 4th Quarter

Bellevue East's Hunter Mengel scored 16 points in the first half to give the Chieftain's a chance to beat the Millard West. The Wildcats outscored East 25-16 in the final period to help seal a 72-58 victory.

Three Seniors scored in double digits for West. Brock Burling led the way with 25 points. Chris Connell and Gio Guido scored 14 points each.

Mengel finished with 22 points for the Chieftains. Fred Knotts added 12 for East.

Millard West took an early lead in the first quarter with balanced scoring. Four Wildcats scored while building a 11-7 lead. East finished the quarter with a with a 12-4 run, including eight points by Mengel. The Chieftains held a 19-15 lead after the first eight minutes of play.

West's offense got on track in the 2nd quarter, scoring on 8 of their first 11 possessions. Burling led the Wildcats with 12 points in the first half. West led 33-29 at the half.

Midway through the first quarter, the two teams were tied 7-7. Millard West's offense got on track and scored on five of their last six possessions of the quarter and led 14-7 at the end of the first quarter.

West's defense kept Benson from getting any easy baskets in the 2nd quarter. The Wildcats outscored the Rabbits 15-5 in the quarter and led 29-12 at the half.
