Wildcats Hold On To Beat Packers

The last minute of the Millard West / Omaha South game kept the fans on the edges of their seats. The Wildcats were able to hold on and win 50-47.

With a minute left in the game, West led 48-43. Jay Saunders scored a basket to pull within 3. Brock Burling converted on two free throws after grabbing an offensive rebound and getting fouled on the put-back.

Taylon Anderson drove to the basket, was fouled and made both free throws to make the score 50-47.

West missed a free throw and had 3 more turnovers in the last 44 seconds of the game. But, Omaha South was not able to take advantage.

"A win is a win, but there were way too many things happening in the last couple minutes," Coach Bill Morrison said. "We need to continue to work on getting better at closing out games."

Brock Burling led the Wildcats with 16 points and 3 blocked shots. Giavonni Guido added 10 points, 9 assists, 6 steals, and 2 blocked shots. Hunter Schnuerle led the team with four rebounds and scored 8 points.

Saunders and Anderson scored 14 and 11 points to lead the Packers.

West started the game strong by jumping out to a 7-3 lead. The Wildcats grabbed 5 offensive rebounds and forced 7 turnovers. Austin Harris scored 7 points in the quarter for West.

The Wildcat defense was able to slow down Omaha South in the 2nd quarter. West built a 29-18 lead before Tyrece Griggs hit a 3-pointer at the end of the quarter. Guido led the Wildcats with 7 points in the quarter.

Coach Morrison was pleased with his team's defense in the 2nd quarter. "I thought we did a great job of stopping the drive. Peyton did a good job of keeping Crawford from getting into a rhythm."

West started the third quarter with a 4-0 run and forced a Packer timeout with just under 6 minutes left to play in the period.

South made a run at the Wildcats. South outscored West 12-2 over the last 6 minutes of the game.

West committed 6 turnovers in the quarter, and South turned the ball over 5 times. South trailed 35-32 at the end of the quarter.



The Wildcats led the entire 4th quarter but never by more than 6 points. Burling led West with 8 points in the 4th quarter.

Silver Hawks Use 3rd Quarter to Fly Past Wildcats

Lincoln Southwest used a 14-0 run in the middle of the 3rd quarter to beat the Millard West Boys Basketball Team 46-54.

With the score tied 30-30 with just over 6 minutes left in the third quarter, the Silver Hawks used their transition offense to score six straight lay ups and take a 44-30 lead.

Jaquaylon Mays and Collin Kohl both led the Silver Hawks with 13 points each. Parker Merwick added 11 for Southwest.

Brock Burling led West with 13

points. Chris Connell added 12 for the Wildcats. Hunter Schnuerle led the team with 6 rebounds.

Millard West used their outside shooting in the first quarter to take a 15-13 lead. The Wildcats made four three-pointers in the quarter, including two by Austin Harris.

Lincoln Southwest continued to take away West's inside game and the Wildcat's cooled off from behind the arc in the 2nd quarter.

Back-to-back baskets by Merwick and Alex Hunzeker gave Southwest a

Coach Morrison was impressed with Southwest's defense in the first half. "We wanted to make a point of getting the ball inside tonight. Their team defense made it very hard for us to get the ball inside."

West started the 3rd quarter by getting the ball to the paint. Burling scored 4 points on the first two possession of the half. A basket by Giavonni Guido

tied the score at 30-30.

Southwest mounted a 14-0 run over the next 8 possessions and led 44-30. West was able to cut the lead to 44-34 with four points by Connell to end the quarter.

"We have to learn how to fight through adversity," Morrison said. "When things go bad, we have to do a better job of getting the momentum back."

West clamped down on defense in the 4th quarter. Southwest was only able to score 5 points in the first seven minutes of the final quarter. A basket by Peyton Buscher brought the Wildcats to within 50-46 with 29.8 seconds left in the game.

West fouled Merwick who made both free throws to keep the Wildcats from coming any closer.
