# Millard West Boys Basketball Wildcat Report

## Warriors Overtake Wildcats in 4th Quarter

Omaha Westside led 5-3 early in the first quarter, but then would not lead again until the 4:41 mark in the final period. The Warriors took the lead on a 3-pointer by Jaden Booth and never looked back in their 56-53 victory.

Booth led all scorers with 28 points, including 23 in the 2nd half. Chase Thompson added 13 for the Warriors.

Brock Burling scored 15 points in the first half and led the team with 17 in the game. Giavonni Guido added 12 points.

Burling set the tone early for the Wildcats as he connected on 5 of 6 field goals in the 1st quarter for 10 points. West led Westside 15-9 at the end of the first period.

The Wildcat defense continued their strong performance in the first half and outscored Westside 15-11 in the quarter to take a 20-30 lead into the half.

Burling added 5 points to his first half total as Austin Harris made two of his three 3-pointers in the 2nd quarter.

"We really wanted to set the tone by attacking Westside in the paint. We did a great job of that until Brock picked up his 2nd foul midway through the 2nd quarter," Coach Bill Morrison said.

After the half, Booth led the charge for the Warriors by making three 3-pointers in a row and erasing the Wildcat's first half lead.

"The first one was a great shot, the 2nd time we lost him, and the 3rd shot we just didn't play defense on him," Morrison said. "We have to figure out how to play better to start the 2nd half.

Millard West was able to hold on to the lead for the rest of the quarter, but only scored 7 points in the period. Booth ended up scoring 13 for

Westside in the 3rd quarter.

A Westside free throw brought the Warriors to within 43-42. Thompson tapped out a missed free throw to Booth who connected for a 3-pointer.

The lead was Westside's first lead since

early in the first quarter. Millard West did not score on their next four possessions. Two free throws by Burling made the score 49-45 in favor of Westside.

Millard West had a chance to tie the game with a free throw and 16.7 seconds left on the board but were unable to convert.

### Wildcats D-throne Monarchs

Millard West used another strong defensive performance in the first half to lead the way to a 59-49 victory over Papillion-LaVista.

The Wildcats held Papio to just 13 points in the first half. Westside was able to cut the lead to 7 in the 4th quarter, but were unable to get any closer.

Six players scored in double digits in the game, three from each team. West was led by Brock Burling with 18 points, Austin Harris scored 16 points, and Hunter Schnuerle added 12.

Peyton Priest led all scorers with 19 points, all in the 2nd half. Hayden Bahl and Jon Carter scored 10 points apiece for the Monarchs.

The two teams had trouble scoring early in the first quarter. Caleb Feekin hit a 3-pointer to make the score 8-7 in favor of Millard West with 2:58 in the first quarter.

West was able to close the quarter on a 8-0 run behind six consecutive points by Brock Burling. The Wildcats led 16-7 at the end of the first quarter.

"We wanted to set the tempo early in the game," Coach Bill Morrison said. "Our half court defense has been really good in the first half of both games this week."

West continued to dominate the Monarchs in the 2nd quarter. Austin Harris scored 5 points in the quarter, including a 3-pointer with 30 seconds left in the half. Harris' basket gave the Wildcats their biggest lead of the half, 31-13.

Harris scored after an offensive rebound midway through the 3rd quarter to give West their biggest lead of the game 42-22.

The Monarchs were more aggressive than they were in the first half. They were able to get to the foul line 15 times in the quarter. Papio was 12/15 from the line in the quarter.

Papio made a couple runs at the Wildcats in the 4th quarter, but West seemed to have the answer every time the Monarchs drew close.

Papio outscored West 18-11 in the final period behind Priest, who scored 13 points in the quarter.

West turned the ball over four times in the 4th quarter, but Papio could not draw any closer than 7 points.
