Wildcats Deliver OT Defeat to Monarchs

Despite trailing for most of the game, Millard West was able to force Papillion La Vista into overtime with a 3-pointer by Austin Harris in the last seconds of their first round game of the Metro Tournament.

After a timeout with 7.6 seconds left in the game. Chris Connell found Harris open in the corner. Harris was able to convert the 3-pointer over the outstretched hands of Peyton Priest.



The Monarchs made 1 of 2 free throws to score first in overtime. Brock Burling scored on an offensive rebound to give the Wildcats a 71-70 lead. West would hold on to the lead for the rest of the game and win the game 78-76.

Burling scored 29 points and grabbed 6 rebounds to lead the Wildcats. Austin Harris added 18 points to the cause. Hunter Schnuerle scored 12 points for the Wildcats. Giavonni Guido scored 10 points, recorded 10 assists and had five steals.

Caleb Feeken led four players in double digits for the Monarchs with 29 points.

Burling helped the Wildcats get off to a good start in the first quarter by scoring six of their first 9 points. After leading 14-12, Papillion made three 3 -pointers to take a 21-14 lead. Burling was able to convert on a basket to close the Monarch lead to 21-16 after the first quarter.

Fifteen of the Monarch's points in the first quarter came from behind the three point line. "Papillion was hot from long range early. We told our guys we had to extend our defense and make sure we have good weak side help in the 2nd quarter," Coach Bill Morrison said.

The Monarchs were only able to make one 3-pointer in the 2nd quarter. Papillion built their biggest lead of the game, 35-24 on a three-point play by Cole Lansman.

Two baskets by Burling, who scored 7 of West's 12 points in the quarter, brought the Wildcats back to 35-28 at the half.

The Monarchs held onto their seven point lead with 2:55 left in the third quarter as the two teams exchanged baskets throughout the first part of the period. West was able to cut the lead to 46-43 with 2:05 left in the period.

West's defense forced seven turnovers in the 4th quarter. The Wildcats cut the lead to one point several times but were unable to gain the lead throughout the 4th quarter.

Papillion was able to hold onto their lead in the 4th quarter due in part to making 10-11 free throws in the period.

Priest scored on an offensive rebound to draw the Monarchs to 78-76. After a timeout, West turned the ball over on a long inbounds pass. A final 3-point attempt fell short for Papillion and the offensive rebound fell out of bounds as the game ended.

"This was a great win for our guys," Coach Morrison said. "We could have quit a lot of times, but kept fighting back."
