# Millard West Boys Basketball Wildcat Report

The Millard West Boys Basketball Team set out to upset the #4 team in the state. And, for the first half, it looked as if the Wildcats were going to upset Omaha Burke.

West jumped out to an 8-3 lead and never trailed in the first half despite being short handed.

Starters Chris Connell and Austin Harris both picked up two early fouls in did not play the majority of the first half. The Wildcats were also without starting center and leading scorer Brock Burling due to injury.

### **Bulldogs Use 2nd Half to Cage Wildcats**

"I think this game says a lot for the progress that we have made so far this season," Coach Bill Morrison commented. "We did not have a lot of returning varsity experience. We are working on building our depth and getting the team ready for districts."

Giavonni Guido and the Wildcat defense set the tone early for West. Burke turned the ball over five times in the 1st quarter. A steal and lay-up by Guido gave the Wildcats a 14-5 lead mid-way through the quarter. The Wildcats held an 18-11 lead at the end of the first quarter..

West started the 2nd quarter with a 7-3 run and held their biggest lead of the game, 25-14, with 5:06 left in the half.

Burke started attacking the basket and finished the half by outscoring the Wildcats 16-8, including 7-10 from the free throw line. The Bulldogs cut the lead to 33-30 at the half.

West had trouble scoring in the third quarter and the Bulldogs slowly took control of the game. Burke outscored the Wildcats 17-7 in the quarter and led by seven, 47-40 going into the final period.

West outscored the Bulldogs 6-1 to start the 4th quarter and cut the lead to 46-48 with 5:14 left in the game.

Shareef Mitchell made sure the Wildcats did not complete the upset. Mitchell scored 9 points over the next four minutes to help secure the win for the Bulldogs.

"We settled for too many jumpers in the third quarter and lost the lead," Morrison said. "I thought we did a good job of battling back, but they went on another run and we rad out of time."

Morrison also talked about his team's defensive performance. "The guys did a great job of executing our game plan defensively. A lot of Burke's scores came in transition. When we were able to set up on defense, we did a pretty good job. We did give up too many o-boards though."

Mitchell led all scorers for Burke with 26 points. Guido scored 22 for the Wildcats.

West used a strong first quarter to build a 19-9 lead over the Vikings. Harris helped West get started by scoring 7 points in the first quarter.


"We are working hard on being more consistent and giving more consistent effort," Morrison said of his team.
