After Slow Start, Wildcats Win by 27

The Millard West Wildcats defeated Omaha Northwest 62-35. Evan Meyersick led the Wildcats with 25 points and 9 rebounds. Dom Humm added 14 points, and James Conway added 12 points.

Landon Broer led the Huskies with 15 points.

Both teams struggled on offense early in the contest. Marrieon Marks scored after an offensive rebound to tie up the game at 4-4 with 3:49 left in the quarter.

Meyersick scored the first eight points for West. The Wildcats led 13-9 at the end of the first quarter.

"We had way too many (7) turnovers in the first quarter," Coach Bill Morrison said. "Their guards pressured us a little and sped us up."

The Wildcats took care of the ball in the 2nd half and was able to extend their lead. Meyersick continued to lead the offensive attack with 10 points in the quarter.

West went on a 6-0 lead at the end of the half to take a 33-18 lead.

The Wildcats came out of the half and turned the ball over on four of their first six possessions. The Husk-

James Conway led the way for the Wildcats as he scored a career high 22 points and grabbed 12 rebounds. Evan Meyersick added 10 points.

Chase Hultman dished out 6 assists and had 3 steals. Dom Humm scored 8 points and had 3 steals. Trace Thaden scored 8 points and grabbed 7 rebounds. Zac Grandgenett scored 8 points.

Elkhorn South was led by Derek Merwick with 9 points. The Storm had 10 players score in the game.

Conway scored the first seven points of the game for the Wildcats to help West build an early 7-2 lead. West scored on nine of their 12 possessions in the first quarter to lead 19-10 after the first period of play.

The Wildcat offense slowed down in the 2nd quarter, but their defense was able to help them maintain their lead.

West only made one field goal in the 2nd quarter. Conway continued to

lead the way. He had 14 points and 8 rebounds in the first half.

"I really like the way this group plays defense!" Coach Bill Morrison said. "Our team defense is very good right now. And we seem to get every rebound."

The Wildcats came out strong in the 3rd quarter. Meyersick, who did not play much in the first half because of foul trouble, scored six points for West in the quarter.

The Wildcats' defense held Elkhorn South to just two points in the first six minutes of the 4th quarter. Humm got a steal and lay-up to give West a 53-32 lead with 2:02 left in the game.

Both teams cleared the benches. Elkhorn South was able to hit two 3-pointers in the last 90 seconds of the game.

"Winning these last two games the way we did is very encouraging. We played great defense and were able to find an offensive rhythm. And we did all of that without Ryan," Morrison said.

Ryan Larsen was not able to play in the past two games because of a close -contact quarantine.

"Bennett was incredible. Going 7/7 from 3-point land in a shooting drill is good, much less in a game," Morrison said.

Morrison thought his team had the right attitude to come back in the 4th quarter.

"We dug too big of a hole in the first half. I am proud of how hard the guys fought back and never gave up," Morrison added.
