## Black and Green Awards Given at Banquet

The Millard West Athletic Department hosted their first ever "Black and Green" night to honor Wildcat players and coaches and to induct former Wildcats into the Millard West Hall of Fame.

Max Frohloff was awarded the NCPA All-State award. Reese Kolar received the Metro Conference Scholar Athlete award.

The Iron Cat Award is given to Seniors who have participated in 11 sports over their four years at Millard West. Chase Hultman and Reese Kolar both received the Iron Cat award. Former players, Jaxson Cahoy and Collin Schollmeyer, also were named to the Iron Cat list.

Avery Moore took away one of the biggest honors of the night. Avery was named the Millard West Male Athlete of the Year. Avery plays both baseball and basketball.

Finally, Coach Rick Hook was inducted into the Millard West Hall of Fame. Coach Hook was the first boys basketball coach at Millard West. He led the Wildcats for the first 14 years that West was open. Three of his teams qualified for the state tournament. The 199-2000 team was the pre-season #1 team in the state.

Coach Hook filled many other roles at Millard West in addition to being the Head Basketball Coach. He coached football, FCA assistant, MBA founder, Wildcat Crazies creator, and was both an assistant and head Athletic Director at the school. In the classroom, Coach Hook taught in the business department and served as the department head for the school.
