Wildcats Comeback to Beat Bulldogs

Millard West had to battle back in the 2nd half to Beat Omaha Burke. After trailing by 12 at the end of the first quarter and seven points at halftime, West won 74-64.

Jessie Cauble had a big game for the Wildcats. He recorded 20 points, 10 rebounds, 6 assists, 3 steals, and a blocked shot.

Avery Moore added 13 points, five rebounds and 3 assists. Trace Thaden added to the cause with 10 points, 8 rebounds, 4 assists, and 4 blocked shots.

Dakarai Davis led the Bulldogs with 24 points. He made six 3-pointers, including four in the first quarter. Amir Martin made four first-half 3-pointers and scored 19 points. Zeb Svoboda added 10 points.

The beginning of the game started with both teams exchanging baskets. Avery Moore scored a basket to give West a 10-9 lead with 4:45 left in the quarter.

The Bulldogs finished the quarter on a 15-2 run. Burke was getting wide open shots after breaking the Wildcat press. The Bulldogs made six 3-pointers in the quarter to take command of the game.

West was not able to score until Jessie Cauble made a basket with 14 seconds remaining to end a 4:31 dry spell.

West used their inside game to battle back early in the 2nd quarter. Thaden made two baskets early in the quarter for West. The Wildcats cut the lead to 23-28 after two free throws by Max Frohloff midway through the period.

Thaden would make another basket with 2:13 left in the half to cut the lead to 29-33. Burke would make a 3-pointer at the end of the period to give them a 7-point lead, 29-36, at the end of the half.

The Wildcats gradually cut into the Bulldog lead in the third quarter. West took their first lead of the 2nd half after a 3-pointer by Cauble with 2:21 left in the quarter. West would not trail for the rest of the game.

“Once we got the lead, Burke tried to full court press us. We did a nice job of handling the pressure and getting easy shots,” Coach Bill Morrison said.

Cauble led the comeback for the Wildcats with 15 second-half points, including nine in the 4th quarter.



“It was nice to see Jessie have a break-out game,” Morrison said. “Especially after the way his season started. He has had a great attitude and continued to work hard.”

Wildcats Fall to Patriots

Cold shooting and turnovers in the first half gave Millard South a 22-8 halftime lead over Millard West as the Patriots won 50-33.

Trace Thaden scored 11 points to lead the Wildcats. Peyton Moore added 10 points.

Austin Trotter led the Patriots with 23 points.

West won the opening tip and started the game on offense. Max Frohloff ended a minute long possession with a 3-pointer for the first points of the game.

The basket by Frohloff would be the only points scored by West in the first quarter. Trotter scored his 7th point of the quarter with 2:19 left on the clock. Neither team would score the rest of the quarter as South led 11-3.

“We just couldn’t find the bottom of the net in the first quarter,” Coach Bill Morrison said. “We got some good looks, but nothing would fall.”

South scored 6 points on their first three possessions to extend their lead to 17-5. West’s defense was able to hold the Patriots off for the next five minutes, but still had trouble scoring.

Trotter made another 3-pointer for his 7th point of the quarter to give South a 20-7 lead with 2:13 left in the half. South took a 22-8 lead into the half.

“Our defense was good enough to be in the game. We didn’t shoot well and had seven turnovers in the first half,” Morrison said. “We just put ourselves in too big of a hole.”

In the 2nd half, Millard South seemed to have an answer every time West seemed to get into some sort of rhythm.

Trotter continued to lead the way for the Patriots. A 3-pointer by Trotter on an offensive rebound to end the 3rd quarter gave South as 36-19 lead.



West found some scoring early in the 4th quarter. South pulled the ball out and spread the court with about 3 minutes left in the game as the Patriots sealed the victory.

Lincoln East used a full court attack to build a lead in the first half and was able to extended their lead in the 2nd half on their way to a 64-39 victory.

Cole Kirschner led the Wildcats with 8 points in the game. Carter Tempelmeyer and Joe Marfisi led the Spartans will 11 and 10 points.

Lincoln East’s defense cause 7 turnovers in the first quarter. Converting turnovers and scoring in transition helped East build a 13-8 lead at the end of the first quarter.

The Wildcats were able to start the 4th quarter on a 7-0 run. The Wildcats would not be able to cut the lead to under 20.

“We will watch tape and learn from this,” Morrison said. “When you are tired, you tend to go back to your habits. We have three weeks to fix some things and be ready for districts.”
