Wildcats Go 7-0 This Week

Wildcats Build Big Lead, Hold on For Victory

Millard West beat Bellevue East 58 -50 in front of a packed house in their home opener Friday night.

Reece Carson led the team with 15 points. Jordan Gasses added 14 points for West. Cooper Fortune had 4 rebounds, 4 blocks, and 2 steals. Cade Walker grabbed 7 rebounds.

Trey Tolbert led the Chieftains with 19 points, and Kris Brown added 13.

West looked to be in control in the first quarter, but 5/13 shooting for West kept the score close. The Wildcats led 12-7 after the first period.

East's Isaac Gore made a basket to make the score 16-12 in favor of West. The Wildcats went on a 15-0 run to extend their lead to 31-12. West held East scoreless on eight straight possessions and led 31-14 at half-time.

"I thought we were forcing some tough shots and were not moving the ball around very well early in the game," Coach Bill Morrison said. "Once we started moving the ball around, we put some points on the board.

West started the 2nd half on a 10-0 run to build their lead to 40-13.

Bellevue East was able to find a rhythm later in the quarter and cut the lead to 42-25. Bust West scored on their last 3 possessions of the quarter to take a 47-27 lead.

West's offense struggled in the 4th quarter. The Wildcats were 2/7 shooting from behind the arc and turned the ball over five times.

The Chieftains made five 3-pointers in the period and got as close as 50-42 before West regained control by scoring on their last four possessions of the game.

"We settled for quick 3's early in the last quarter. Then we turned the ball over on four straight possessions to let them get back into the game," Morrison said.

"I told the guys that we need to build on what we did in the first 20 minutes and learn from what happened in the 4th quarter.

Wildcats Pull-Away from Tigers in Second Half

Millard West used a 38-22 second half to beat Fremont 70-51 and increase their record to 3-1 on the season.

Cooper Fortune led the Wildcats with 17 points on 7/10 shooting and 3/3 from the line. Max Frohloff and Reece Carson added 14 and 13 points respectively. Cade Walker grabbed seven rebounds in his first start of his career.

Coriahnn Gallatin was the only Tiger win double-digits with 17 points.

The two teams played back and forth throughout the first quarter. Their were seven lead changes and two ties in the quarter. Fremont missed a free-throw with 3.9 seconds remaining. Fortune outlet the ball to Jordan Gassen who made a 3-pointer at the buzzer to give West a 20-17 lead.

Fremont took a 26-23 lead after a Gallatin 3-pointer with 5:12 left in the half. West went on a 7-0 run and would not trail the rest of the game. West led 32-29 at the half.

"Our offense got a little stagnant in the 2nd quarter," Coach Bill Morrison said. "We get dribble happy every once in a while. It hurt us early in the quarter.

Both teams' offenses picked up in the 3rd quarter. West scored on nine of their last ten possessions of the quarter, including 8/8 from the free throw line.

But, during that stretch, Fremont was able to convert four 3-pointers and another field goal to stay in reach of the Wildcats. West led 52-43 going into the final period.

The Wildcats' defense only allowed 3 field goals in the 4th quarter and

was able to pull away with the victory.

"A lot of our guys had their best game of the season," Coach Morrison said. "This was our most complete game."

"I was really impressed with our defense," Morrison added. "Fremont had to earn everything they got. And, I thought Jordan and Trye (Abara) did a pretty good job on Gallatin."


