## South Packs Up Victory Over Wildcats

The Wildcats had a tough time scoring at Omaha South on Thursday night as the Packers beat Millard West 60-47.

Jay Saunder and TaeVeon Anderson led the Packers with 23 and 16 points respectively. Evan Meyersick was the only Wildcat in double digits with 13 points.

Three minutes into the game the score was tied 6-6. Then the Wildcats did not score the rest of the quarter. South had a hard time scoring as well. The score after the first eight minutes was 10-6.

West seemed to get back on track and pulled to within 15-14 after an offensive rebound and put-back by Aabid Sidiqi. But, the Wildcats would not score in the final four minutes of the half and went into the half down 21-14.

"We played good enough defensively to be in the game," Coach Bill Morrison said. "But when you don't rebound and don't shoot it well, it's pretty tough to stay in a game."

In the 2nd half, the Packers drove hard to the basket and extended their

lead to 30-17. West trailed 39-25 after the 3rd quarter.

The Wildcats kept battling and were able to get the lead under 10 points a couple times. South won the game 60-47.

West was 1-18 from behind the 3 point arc for the game and gave up 18 offensive rebounds to the Packers.

"We just couldn't get into a rhythm offensively," Morrison said. We had the right people taking shots. It was just a tough shooting night. That's why you have to be solid on the boards and on the defensive end. There are going to be nights where you don't shoot well."
